

COVID-19 Safety Measures



- Staggered drop-off and pick-up times to limit direct contact with parents/caregivers as much as possible. Centers will provide instructions to families with specific instructions tailored to their locations.
- Daily health screening of any person entering the building, including children, staff and approved visitors, to identify symptoms, diagnosis, or exposure to COVID-19.
- Recording details in a Daily Health Screening Log.
- “Wear-Wait-Wash” posters at entrance and in classrooms to promote face coverings, social distancing and hand washing.

Non-medical masks, bandanas, or scarves can also be used.

- Hand washing with soap, frequent use of hand sanitizer and tissues, and frequent hygiene breaks.
- Isolation of anyone who shows COVID-19 symptoms, followed by sending them home safely as soon as possible.
- Mandatory isolation or quarantine of children or staff who have tested positive for COVID-19, have COVID-19 symptoms, or have been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 or COVID-19 symptoms.
- Maintaining “pods” - groups of children in assigned rooms throughout the day with the same childcare providers.
- Daily health screening of any person entering the building, including children, staff and approved visitors, to identify symptoms, diagnosis, or exposure to COVID-19.
- Face coverings for all staff and for children over the age of 2 when possible.
- Regular cleaning and disinfecting of frequently touched objects and surfaces (such as toys, cubbies, doorknobs, counter tops, etc.).
- Prioritizing outdoor time when possible.
